

District Young Adult Coordinator Role Description

Overview - The United Methodist Church has claimed for its mission statement, “Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World”.

The Cal-Pac Conference young adult ministries are seeking to live that out. Equipping young people to grow in their relationship with God is at the center of all we do. The main role of the District Youth Coordinator is to bridge between the conference, district, and local churches to create opportunities for the discipleship of young adults. The Coordinator should be a person who is earnestly following Christ in seeking God’s sanctification and can disciple young people with integrity. The expectation is 10 hours a month with some extended time for retreats and events.

Responsibilities

Serve the local church

- Connect to the local churches, young adult, and campus ministers enough to be able to advocate at conference level for them.
- Be familiar enough with the local churches and their young adult and campus ministers to be able to talk up district and conference events and ministries.
- Be accessible to the young adult and campus ministers in your district for coaching, resources, and support.
- Be connected and have some oversight with any district young adult event.
- Keep an updated list of churches and their young adult and campus ministry contacts.

Serve the district

- Lead the district “A” team meetings
- Lead the selection of young adult reps from the district to CCYA
- Meet at least annually with the DS

Serve on CCYA

- Actively participate in and support CCYA and its ministries
- Actively disciple the young leadership in our conference
- Contribute to the conference newsletter, “The Aquila”
- Be in frequent contact with our conference liaison, Fernando Alcántar.

The District Young Adult Coordinator must be between the ages of 19 and 35.
